INTRODUCTION

The members of the Diocesan Liturgy Commission have produced the following 'tropes' for the third form of the Penitential Act as a resource for Lent. The structure reflects the form outlined in the General Instruction of the Roman Missal, whereby the invocation is directed to Jesus and does not take the form of a request or petition from the assembly.

The invocations have been written in reflection of the gospel for the appropriate Sunday, and where possible, drawing three main themes from the gospel to hopefully provide a meditation on the clear message they have.

Musical settings are provided, including the troped sentence, and the Kyrie from Mass XVI (Missal Tones) in both Greek and English.






