- ❖ If you need any help or are unsure about anything, don't hesitate to ask a Group Leader or one of the Team.
- There will be volunteers providing security 24 hours a day but valuables left in your tent will be at your own risk.

If anyone is hurt and needs First Aid...

• Find the closest member of the Ignite Team/Ignite Lite, or another volunteer, and get them to get in touch with the First Aider verbally or by radio.

- If possible, go to the First Aid Point which is on the Site Map and where there is a First Aid kit.
- If an emergency unconscious or not breathing phone 999.

Site Rules

Strictly no alcohol or drugs.
Smoking is not permitted on the school site including e-cigarettes.
Chewing gum is not permitted on the school site.
No males in female sleeping areas and no females in male sleeping areas.
There are separate toilets for males and females and those over 18 and under 18. Please make sure you use the correct ones!
Quiet in the camp after 11pm.
The Kitchen area is out of bounds (except to the catering team) and the dining room only open during meal times. There are places where you can fill your water bottles on-site. At various times throughout the weekend the café will be open where you can buy refreshments.
Look after property and buildings.
Keep the site clean and tidy. Put litter in bins.
Unacceptable behaviour will result in you being asked to leave.
