Enjoy a kick-about! Plain and simple.



### GENERAL INFORMATION

- ❖ If you need any help or are unsure about anything, don't hesitate to ask a Group Leader or one of the Team.
- ❖ There will be volunteers providing security 24 hours a day but valuables left in your tent will be at your own risk.
- The Sacred Heart School where we host Ignite is a great venue, except there are very few showers! So please:

If you can survive without a shower, please do.

Be as quick as possible in the shower

Make use of free time to take a shower, rather than morning and evening.

## If anyone is hurt and needs First Aid...

- Find the closest member of the Ignite Team/Ignite Lite, or another volunteer, and get them to get in touch with the First Aider verbally or by radio.
- If possible, go to the First Aid Point or the First Aid Room which are on the Site Map and where there is a First Aid kit.
- If an emergency unconscious or not breathing phone 999.

### **Site Rules**

- Strictly no alcohol or drugs.
- Smoking is not permitted on the school site including e-cigarettes.
- Chewing gum is not permitted on the school site.
- No males in female sleeping areas and no females in male sleeping areas.
- ➤ There are separate toilets for males and females and those over 18 and under 18. Please make sure you use the correct ones!
- Quiet in the camp after 11pm.
- ➤ The Kitchen area is out of bounds (except to the catering team) and the dining room only open during meal times. At various times throughout the weekend the tuckshop will be open where you can buy refreshments.
- Look after property and buildings.
- > Keep the site clean and tidy. Put litter in bins.
- > Unacceptable behaviour will result in you being asked to leave.

## Keeping safe and well

- > During the Festival there are times where we may have live music, smoke machines, flashing lights and talks which can deal with tricky or emotional subjects. If you find this overwhelming or upsetting at any point, you can talk to a member of the team or your Group Leader.
